EDUCATIONAL MILESTONE

Every child deserves the opportunity to get access to quality education. On 15th of December, we celebrated 18 of our children who graduated to next level (grade 1). We believe in the

transformative power of education through integration of the elderly in various activities including art and craft, environmental promotion among others. And through engagement of such kind we are not only fighting loneliness and isolation among 30 elderly persons but also contributing to SDG 3 on good health and wellbeing.

SEASONAL COMMUNITY CELEBRATION

Holidays are meant for celebrations and re union. While many people find joy and happiness to join together as families, many elderly people feel isolated and neglected. This contributes to 60% cases of depression and other mental illnesses among the elderly. We extended our care to over 25 elderly members doing house visits, putting up cone gardens and assisted with chores during the Christmas and new year celebrations .We equally joined hands with Ziba Pengo (Close the Gap) and Mukuru Angaza film academy to raise awareness on mental health, reaching out to over 500 individuals.

LOOKING AHEAD

As part of our commitment to our elderly members and their grandchildren, we plan to install 30 water handy flow pots and 30 hanging shower jerrycans. To put up a gazebo training hall, 2 permanent classrooms for the children and install 40 corn gardens for the elderly to enhance food security.
